FROM THE DIRECTOR OF CONGREGATIONAL CARE

"They were permeated with a deep sense of reverence for God." Acts 9:31b

While watching Bev untangle the mess of blue yarn, one could see the patience and purpose it took to accomplish the frustrating task. She was committed to see a manageable ball of yarn made out of the snags and snarls so something beautiful and useful could be knit together.

I began to hum the refrain from Jamie Slocum's CD; "sometimes I picture God that way, untangling all the mess I've made. Unraveling my darkest night to weave a brand new day."

We find ourselves in circumstance so difficult there seems to be no solution. Some of these darkest nights are of our own making. Others are due to other factors. Has anyone escaped making a mess or causing one for another? Don't think so.

Billy Graham once said, "Only God can unscramble eggs." Have you ever tried it? So why do we think we can overcome our darkest nights with our own wisdom and abilities?

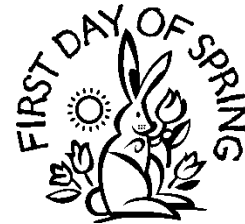
